Choosing your new windows

If you're reading this you've probably been thinking about investing in new windows (or doors) for quite a while. We'd like to suggest you don't rush at this stage. This is the time to make the right choices – before you commit.

Designing your windows

When you're exploring the idea of new windows, knowing a little about the available styles can help. There are no hard and fast rules, but certain styles definitely look more at home in some properties.

The windows you choose should complement the architecture of your home. That may mean that you don't want a like-for-like replacement.

Stroll around the area where you live. Look for properties where the windows add to the appearance of a home.

Note the colours that work well with the local building materials, it's possible to make almost any style or shape of window, in any size, and there's a vast choice of colour and finish.

Rules, Regs & Planning Permission

You don't normally need planning permission for replacement windows, but if you're in a conservation area or your property is listed, there may be restrictions on what type or style of window you can have. Check with your local authority for advice if you're not sure.

If you're OK to go ahead, that's great, but it's worth knowing that replacing windows comes under the scope of the Building Regulations. These are designed to ensure safety, energy-efficiency and adequate ventilation.

As members of FENSA (Number 29329), one of the government-authorised Competent Persons Schemes*, we'll make sure that the works comply and will provide the certification you need to prove that the job's been done right.

Security

It's important that locks, handles and hinges – even frames and glazing – do their job and protect you and your family. Look out for features like multipoint locking, tested to the latest British Standards BS7950 security criteria and a Secured-by-Design accredited locking system. Also egress hinges where possible, which allow a window to open to 90° for emergency escape.

Energy efficiency and glazing choices

Window Energy Ratings (WER) were originally introduced in 2004 to help consumers compare the energy efficiency of different products. Taking into account the products solar gain (G factor - deemed a benefit at that time) and heat loss.


Building Regulations 2023 edition, Approved Doc L was updated to concentrate more on retaining heat (reducing heat loss) and less about the solar gain. This is measured by a U-value.

A U-value measures how effective a material is as an insulator. The lower the U-value is, the better the material is as a heat insulator. This shift is now more in line with" New Build" Regulations concentrating on how energy efficient a product is in retaining any heat, i.e. it's U-Value.

Building Regulations Approved Doc L 2023 for Existing Dwellings requires a minimum U-Value of 1.4.

The majority of our PVCu double glazed windows have a U-Value of 1.2 or triple glazed 0.89. Please see your quote for the exact U-value relating to your chosen product.

Window styles

Don't be put off by the jargon – it's really very simple to describe the style of a window. It only means how the window opens or where it is hinged. The most popular styles are casement, sash and tilt





Casement:

They have outward-opening panes (knownaslightsorvents), hingedfrom the top or side, possibly combined

with fixed panes (known as fixed lights). Flush casements mean that when the window is closed, it sits flush within the frame, creating a flat surface on the outside.



Sash:

Sash windows have two panes, one vertically above the other – and both panes can slide to allow ventilation from the top or bottom.



Tilt & turn:

They open inwards – they are hinged at the base and tilt into the room for ventilation. After a turn of the handle they become side-hinged, allowing the window to swing into the room for cleaning.

Buying your windows and doors

- Ask what Window Energy Rating your windows will achieve ask to see the certificate
- Understand locking systems and security features on offer
- Understand whether your window frames will be reinforced, and ask to see a sample
- Have you considered night vents or trickle vents?
- Ask about all the options of windows (and doors) you can choose from
- Have you seen samples of the colour options you can choose from?
- What is the warranty, does it cover manufacturing and installation? Which items are covered and how long for?

The outward-opening **casement window** is perfect for bay and bow windows, for bedrooms and box rooms. Trickle vents...

In June 22 Building Regulations, Approved Document F, was updated to require dwellings to be **suitably ventilated** and avoid overheating by introducing background ventilation which requires the majority of replacement windows and doors to be fitted with trickle vents

Flush casement windows...

When you live in an older or unusual property, standard window designs can often end up compromising the appearance of your home.

They don't reflect the original character or style of the building, and although they may function perfectly well, their appearance isn't quite right.

Flush casement is different - it recreates the style of traditional craftsman-built timber windows. The opening panes don't stand proud of the frame but sit flush, nestled within it.



Profiles

If you were to take a cross-section through a PVCu window frame, as well as the clever, insulating multi-chambered design and all the strengthening ribs, you'd see the shape of the frame. Broadly speaking these can be grouped into 'Chamfered', 'Sculptured' or 'Flush' profiles.



A wide range of glazing styles

Not all glass is the same. As well as the different patterns of glass, various surface treatments can improve the insulating performance of glass or make it easier to keep clean. For doors and glazing near to floor level, toughened glass is a must.

If you have feature stained glass in your existing windows, it's worth knowing that these can be incorporated into your brand-new windows.



Double glazed units

Choosing new windows with energy efficient glass will reduce the energy consumption when compared with standard window glass and frames, whilst also reducing your heating bills.

It is important to ensure your home is as energy efficient as possible. The use of traditional hard coat low emissivity glass has become less and less over time, largely due to legislation changes as U values are typically higher and the glass is not as energy efficient. This has created a path for the next generation of soft coat low emissivity glass units. Soft coat products deliver superior thermal performance and are far more neutral in appearance than the previous hard coat low emissivity products.

Our supplier offers two different types of units, branded Ecopane and EcopanePlus. The Ug-value (glass only) of these products are 1.2 and 1.00



Triple glazed units

Triple glazing is just as it sounds, there are three panes of glass in the unit with two voids which are filled with Argon Gas. This increases the thickness of the unit and slows down the thermal transfer.

A double glazed unit is 24mm or 28mm thick.

Our triple glazed units are 40mm thick resulting in a window U- value of 0.89 (the Ug-value – glass only- is 0.5) when using Ecoplus glass.

Acoustic glazed units

The outer pane of the double glazed unit is made with Acoustic laminated glass, 6.4mm thick, to improve sound reduction.

The glass is made with special PVB (polyvinylbutyral) interlayers. The inner pane of the double glazed unit remains the same as a standard double glazed unit.

The noise reduction is approx. 34db (decibels) but this will depend on the location of the window and its surroundings.

A lawn mower is approx. 90db, a hoover approx. 70db, a normal voice approx. 60db and 30db is similar to a whispered voice.

Patterned textured glass

Five levels of privacy are available – graded from 1 (least obscuration), to 5 (greatest obscuration).




